NAMBUCCA VALLEY AQUAPONICS

Nambucca Valley Aquaponics is a fairly new enterprise run by Luke Tutt and his dad on the family farm in Congarinni. A local chef by trade, Luke has embarked on growing good quality fresh vegetables, fruit and herbs himself. Luke supplies local business with fresh produce and he has established a foodbox distribution program. Luke runs farm and educational tours and is happy to show anyone around.

What types of fish are used on the property? And why? Each tank holds a different species of fish. We have koi, silver perch and rainbow trout, each fish performs differently in the system .The koi are a great all year round fish and are able to cope with varying temperature change which makes them a perfect choice to have here.The silver perch go dormant in the winter time and don't provide the nutrients that are required to run a system in winter however, the Silver Perch are an excellent fish to eat fresh or smoked. We find that by having a variety of different fish we are able to maintain the system all year round and we hope to be able to sell fresh and smoked fish in the future.

Does the property only use Aquaponics to produce crops? No, the property has ground crops, an aquaponic sytem and a hydroponic system that is currently being converted to aquaponics. We grow a variety of herbs, lettuces, edible flowers, exotic vegetables, root vegetables and some old classics like grammas and pumpkins.

Biosecurity – What types of things does Nambucca Valley Aquaponics do to ensure that pests and disease do not contaminate crops?


The Aquaponics system is set up so that each tank of fish only provides for a section of the complete system. If disease was to breakout or the water was to be contaminated we would only lose a section of the greenhouse and not the whole lot.


How can people find out more about Nambucca Valley Aquaponics?
